

## **Allegiance Message 5 REFLECTION QUESTIONS**

- 1. In Matthew 28:18–20, Jesus begins with a declaration of His authority.**  
Why do you think Jesus emphasized His authority before giving the Great Commission?  
How does this shape your understanding of your mission as a disciple?
- 2. The word “Go” in the Great Commission is better understood as “As you are going.”**  
What places and relationships do you encounter in your daily life where you could live out this mission more intentionally?
- 3. The word “disciple” means apprentice, not just convert.**  
What does it look like in practical terms to be an apprentice of Jesus in your current season of life?
- 4. Acts 1:8 says we will receive “power” to be witnesses.**  
Where do you currently feel weak, hesitant, or unprepared in representing Jesus?  
How might the Spirit empower you specifically in that area?
- 5. The Greek word for witness—μάρτυρες (*mártures*)—suggests boldness, even in the face of risk.**  
Are there any places in your life where you're being invited to step out in boldness for the sake of Christ?
- 6. Revelation 1:5–6 says Jesus has made us a kingdom and priests.**  
What does it mean to you that you're not just a servant of Jesus, but also a royal ambassador and priest?
- 7. “You don’t need a microphone to be a missionary.”**  
What are some of the most ordinary settings where you could have a gospel impact this week?
- 8. Of the three roles discussed—disciple-maker, witness, and ambassador—which one resonates most with you?**  
Which one challenges you the most, and why?
- 9. What’s one specific act of obedience or love you can carry out this week that reflects the reign of King Jesus?**  
(Example: Reaching out to someone hurting, forgiving a difficult person, speaking truth when it’s hard, etc.)
- 10. The message asked, “When you walk into a room, do others know who you represent?”**  
What’s one practical way you can more clearly reflect Jesus’ presence in your words, actions, or priorities this week?
