

## Discussion Questions: Rich Toward God

*Luke 12:13–21*

1. **What does the phrase “rich toward God” mean to you?**
  - How is it different from being “rich in things”?
2. **Have you ever found yourself in a “crisis of abundance,” unsure what to do with more than enough?**
  - How did you handle it?
3. **Jesus says, “Life does not consist in an abundance of possessions.”**
  - What does your life currently consist of? What do you value most?
4. **In what ways do you see our culture (or your own heart) living like the rich fool, ie, trusting in barns, not God?**
5. **The rich fool never talks to anyone but himself in the parable.**
  - What might change in your decisions or attitude if you consistently brought God and others into the conversation?
6. **Psalm 14:1 says, “The fool says in his heart, ‘There is no God.’”**
  - What are subtle ways we can live “as if there is no God” when it comes to money or stuff?
7. **What do you think God wants you to hold more loosely in your life right now?**
  - What might be one step toward doing that?
8. **What would it look like for you or your family to be more intentionally generous this week?**
  - Is there something you could give—time, money, space, attention—to someone else?
9. **Jesus doesn’t just warn against greed—He invites us into a better kingdom vision.**
  - How does your faith shape the way you view success, security, and blessing?
10. **Think of a time you felt truly content—not because of what you had, but because of who you were with or what you were doing.**
  - How can you pursue more of that kind of richness?
