

Discussion Questions

1. **The Manager's Shrewdness**

Jesus commended the dishonest manager's *shrewdness* (not his dishonesty). What does it look like to be "shrewd for the kingdom" in your daily life?

2. **Eternal Perspective**

How often do you think about eternity when you make financial, career, or life decisions? How might your choices look different if eternity was always on your mind?

3. **Unrighteous Wealth**

Jesus calls money "unrighteous wealth" that will one day fail. Why do you think He framed it this way? How does this change how you view what's in your wallet or bank account?

4. **Investing in People**

Jesus urges us to use money to "make friends" for eternal purposes. Can you think of a time when someone's generosity had an eternal impact on you, or when yours impacted someone else?

5. **Faithfulness in Little**

Jesus says if we're faithful with little, we'll be faithful with much. What "small things" in your life right now are opportunities to practice faithfulness?

6. **True Riches**

What do you think Jesus means by "true riches"? How do they differ from financial wealth, and how can we pursue them?

7. **Two Masters**

Jesus warns that we can't serve both God and money. What are some ways money tries to act like a "master" in our lives?

8. **A Mammon Audit**

If someone looked at your budget and your calendar, what would they conclude is most important to you? Where might you need to re-center your allegiance on God?

9. **Practical Reallocation**

What is one concrete way you could reallocate your resources (time, money, energy) this week toward something with eternal significance?

10. **Lesson for the Road**

The takeaway from this sermon was: *Walking with Jesus means being faithful with what you have, treating everything as God's and using it for His Kingdom.* What would it look like for you to live that out more fully this week?
